A lifelong learner, Najwa is working on a thesis about Phoenician women, demonstrating how their status had an impact on all women in the Mediterranean region more than 2,000 years ago. As the legal advisor for VIA, she is honored to be working with WCI to promote its values of friendship, understanding, and education for a more peaceful world.
